The Interschool Language Immersion Summer Program is designed to give Middle School students the unique opportunity to experience language immersion without having to step on a plane. The program is conducted solely in Spanish, French or Mandarin, and activities are designed to teach and reinforce language skills while the students have fun. This special summer opportunity is open to students who are entering 5th grade through 9th grade, and students are grouped according to both grade level and language proficiency.
